

# DUST MOP LAUNDERING CHECKLIST

Learn how to wash dust mops properly to prevent dirt buildup and maintain floor cleaning effectiveness.

## Pre-Wash

- Shake out or vacuum all loose debris before washing
- Separate dust mop heads from wet mops, restroom cloths, and kitchen textiles
- Inspect for backing damage or fiber matting that indicates replacement is needed

## Wash Cycle

- Use low-residue detergent at the minimum effective dose
- No fabric softener
- No bleach
- Warm water only (not hot)

## Rinse and Dry

- Run a full rinse cycle; add a second if mop heads feel stiff after drying
- Air dry when possible, or tumble dry on low heat
- Do not overdry

## Storage

- Hang mop heads vertically to prevent fiber compression
- Store in a clean, dry area away from chemicals and moisture
